



Director's Note

In the shadow of WWII, for the first time in history people were receiving live news and real-time reports of events as they unfolded. Catastrophes like the crash of the Hindenburg were being broadcast via radio into people's homes. Orson Welles used the format of a news broadcast to mount a radio play, based on the H.G. Wells novel "War of the Worlds", about a Martian invasion of Earth. The perception was that some people believed that aliens were invading Earth and chaos ensued.

We were then, and are now, living through the unimaginable. We can relate to those who could believe that just about anything calamitous was possible, including a Martian invasion of New Jersey.

"War of the Worlds: The Panic Broadcast" by Joe Landry is meant as a cautionary tale about panic and fear used by media companies to keep us permanently on edge. It contains within it the original script from the 1938 broadcast but it is set in a world in which a group of actors remakes the original script on stage.

We have taken this story from the stage into the world of social media. We use the characters from the original 1938 broadcast of Professor Pierson (the Hero) and The Stranger (The Villain) to represent opposing and often intertwined sides of the social media spectrum. You are about to see these characters as budding social media influencers who find two unwitting and unknown YouTubers who are obsessed with Orson Welles and the original 1938 broadcast. Through messaging and ingenuity, the Professor and The Stranger use the original script from 1938 and create a version of War of the Worlds that exists across social media platforms. As their production goes viral, the Professor and The Stranger split over what to do next. The Stranger, believing that humanity is not to be trusted, cares not for the truth but only for power and dominance. The Professor wants to use the project as a cautionary tale, believing in the essential good in humanity and the power of art to reveal it.

Finally it goes without saying that this year's SDF process has been like no other. Yet, for this intrepid senior class and their families, it is fitting that their work be unique and set apart from any class in the history of the school. Their resourcefulness, grit and sublime talent will be memorialized for years to come. They will have, after all, filmed four full-length theatrical experiences. Epic. I am amazed at our ability to shift and, despite not being able to even act in the same space together, we connected and we created. My gratitude and respect to Cerv, Buff, and Warden who, along with all of our faculty, share in my great sense of accomplishment for what our students have been able to survive and thrive through.

Director's Note

When asked the question, "What is Coney Island Avenue about?" my wonderfully astute assistant director, Léo Ortega, responded quite simply, "It's about the people of Brooklyn." I agree with this statement and would add the following: "It's also about the people who made it." This is the beautiful thing about devised theater making: the voices and experiences of the ensemble are infused in the DNA of the production.

The author of this play, Charles Mee, states, "There is no such thing as an original play." He goes on to explain that most of his plays were created in the spirit of the Dada collage artists (or Fatagaga) of the 1920s. Coney Island Avenue is an assemblage of images and texts from: The Tales of Birbal from the Court of Emperor Akbar, Harry Golden, Betty Smith and material from the internet including blogs and podcasts. Mr. Mee encourages us to "pillage his plays," and to re-make them as we go.

So, in keeping with the playwright's wishes, that's exactly what we endeavored to do. We learned as much as we could about the history of this place, the people who live there and the various sources of Mee's materials. Then the students wrote, envisioned and manifested this piece of filmed-theater through the lens of their 2021 existence. What you're about to see celebrates the diversity of our cast and highlights what they consider to be the essence of Coney Island and surrounding neighborhoods of South Brooklyn.

There are many stories in this play, not just one. There is no clear beginning, middle or end. It is a series of non-linear moments or "blips," that when viewed side-by-side creates a singular work that can mean something as different and specific as the individual audience member viewing the piece. It is in this spirit that we made this work and which we ask you to share with us and enjoy.

Director's Note

"When all the world is a hopeless jumble and the raindrops tumble all around Heaven opens a magic lane...."

For 16 months, many of us have been home. HOME...

It takes on a different meaning to all of us. The great migration of artists and performers leaving New York City to go home, at first, was heartbreaking. Yet, it reminded me of innate humanity to venture into new places, experience significant obstacles and loss, then share the stories when we're home. As a human race, we lost so much and still found hope. Like Dorothy, we ventured into ourselves to see where we belonged. Taking risks, battling the 'witches of Zoom' or confronting the monsters that lingered in the corners of our minds, we faced ourselves. In doing so, we recognized that we had to do better; we had to be better.

Throughout the shutdown... unplanned, my entire family watched "The Wizard of Oz." However, what struck me was the wonderment of my seven-year-old nephew experiencing this story for the first time. Lost in the imagery and cantor of Judy Garland in pristine black and white, into the transference into vivid technicolor, it took his breath away, and it took my breath away to witness the pure wonder of his connection to this story.

Ozians: you never cease to amaze me with how you approach challenges. It has been my honor to watch your work and growth. Director's Note

The Tempest is said to have been one of the last plays Shakespeare wrote, and was perhaps his farewell letter to the stage. In The Tempest, Shakespeare explores his own role as master manipulator and maker of magic through the character of Prospero and her rough magic.

We wanted to reimagine The Tempest for today's audience and for our students. Prospero, traditionally played by an older male actor, is now a powerful woman, mother, and sorceress. Caliban, the colonized native of the island, became a lost boy and street artist. The King of Naples and her company: CEO's of fashion conglomerates. Trinculo and Stephano, traditionally the drunken butler and clown figures typical of the Elizabethan era, became social media interns hungry for followers.

We begin our play with a storm. Think of The Tempest as the season finale, where we hit the ground running. In a quick season recap in Act 1.2, we learn that twelve years ago, Prospero was overthrown from her post as CEO of Milan Corp by her sister Antonia, fleeing to a deserted island with her infant daughter Miranda, and landing somewhere off the coast of Manhattan. For twelve years she plots and ruminates until fate brings her enemies right to her doorstep.

The Tempest begins with an exploration of revenge and the human need for power and control: to tame, subdue, and even exploit what's wild and different. Themes ever present today. Prospero, with the help of Ariel, Miranda, and Fernanda (who view their fellow humans as things of beauty and wonder), and her own soul searching, transforms, realizing that to forgive is where true strength lies. "The rarer action is in virtue than in vengeance." She becomes empowered by accepting the need for balance – the balancing act that every artist faces...existing both in the pedestrian world and the world of the imagination.

And here we are, still in the midst of a global pandemic, in the storm and chaos of this past year, letting go of the way the world used to be. Embracing long overdue changes. Adjusting to this new life. Humans are always struggling to let go. We are creatures of habit and nostalgia.

I am so proud of this cast. They offered their endless creativity and ideas and navigated change after change. This project was truly an exercise in adaptability, problem solving, and creativity. Our project, like Prospero's, is to please, to enchant, and to remind you for a few hours that we are such stuff as dreams are made on....



THE FREDERICK LOEWE FOUNDATION

Emily Altman, President

FREDERICK LOEWE (Music) wrote the scores for some of America's most memorable musicals, including My Fair Lady, Camelot, Brigadoon, Paint Your Wagon and Gigi. Among his most famous songs with lyricist-partner Alan Jay Lerner are "Almost Like Being in Love," "I Could Have Danced All Night" and "Thank Heaven for Little Girls." A musical prodigy, Loewe was born in Austria in 1901 and, at his debut at 13, was the youngest piano soloist to play with the Berlin Philharmonic. Struggling to find work on Broadway after arriving in the US in 1924, Loewe worked at odd jobs, including cattle punching, gold prospecting, prize fighting and playing piano in movie theaters accompanying silent films. In 1942, Loewe approached Alan Lerner at New York's Lamb's Club about collaborating on a show -- thus beginning one of Broadway's most extraordinary partnerships. In 1947, Lerner and Loewe had their first Broadway hit, Brigadoon, followed in 1951 by a second success with Paint Your Wagon. In 1956, My Fair Lady -- often called the "perfect musical" -- opened on Broadway. The show ran for 2,717 performances and the cast album sold more than five million copies. Their 1958 film musical, Gigi, won nine Academy Awards and in 1960 came their last great success. Camelot. starring Richard Burton and Julie Andrews. The winner of numerous Tony, Academy and Golden Globe awards, Loewe died in Palm Springs, California in 1988.
